The RI Significant Service Award recognized club projects that have:

- Addressed a significant problem or need in a local area (International service projects, no matter how worthy, are not eligible for this award).
- Involved most or all of the club's members in personal rather than monetary service
- Been commensurate with the size of the club in its available resources
- Enhanced the image of Rotary in the community
- Been able to be emulated by other Rotary clubs
- Been active during the Rotary year for which the award is being given (Though it need not have been initiated, and may have been completed, in the current Rotary year).

Zone Public Image Award available on the Zone 33-34 Website

Guardian of Ethics and Vocational Excellence Award nomination form available on District 6920 website.

Club of the Year will be awarded to the club that has attained the highest points in its size category.
